Vision

To develop and provide eye care facilities in Ganjam and neighboring districts of Orissa and Andhra Pradesh. To reduce the prevalence of preventable blindness through appropriate measures. To develop human resource for providing eye care service. To provide General Health Care Services with an emphasis on women & children to improve their quality of life by reducing un-necessary disease burden and intervention in preventive, curative and rehabilitative aspect.

Mission

To serve the people of southern part as well as whole of Orissa and adjacent states regardless of caste, creed or religion with a particular focus on the poor and marginalized in society, through the provision of quality care consisting of essential eye services, community eye health, general health, development and spiritual ministry in the name and spirit of the Lord Jesus Christ, so as to make Him known in word and deed.



History

ECOS was born out of a vision of Dr. Mihir Kumar Bal when God saved his life from a near fatal road accident in 1984, while returning from an eye camp. He could see the purpose of God for which his life was saved. He considers life after that accident as a gift from God to serve Blind people. Taking a step in faith, he resigned from Government job and with the support of friends in Emmanuel Hospital Association(EHA) New Delhi, & EHA European Fellowship ECOS Ministry took shape in 1st May 1991 and was registered as a charitable society in 1992. Contribution and encouragement of EHA in the formative years of ECOS has remained as an unforgettable memory in the life of ECOS.

ECOS started a base eye hospital "ECOS Eye Hospital" in a rental building at Giri Road, Brahmapur, Odisha. It is the first eye hospital in Southern Orissa. It works in the love and spirit of Jesus Christ irrespective of Caste, Creed or Religion. It has done pioneering works in the field of Community Ophthalmology in Southern part of Orissa and neighbouring district of Andhra Pradesh. Christoffel Blinden Mission (CBM) International works in partnership with ECOS from 1992. CBM and World Bank Assistance Programme through Government of India (NPCB) has helped ECOS to have permanent infrastructure at 3rd Tota Street.

Federal Ministry for Economic Co-operation and Development Germany (BMZ), CBM Germany and CBM SARO Bangalore helped us to have a permanent structure (Annex building) of four floors at 3rd Tota Street, Bijipur, Brahmapur (In front of present hospital). The foundation stone was laid on 01 May 2013 and we shifted to this new building on 23 Mar 16. It was officially inaugurated on 14 Apr 2016, along with "Silver Jubilee" function.

Geographical Loacation

Ganjam district, the largest and thickly populated district of Odisha is in the Southern Part of the State with population of more than 36Lakhs. Brahmapur is the main town which is very near to the official District Headquarter Chatrapur. It has a population of about six lakhs. The famous beach, Gopalpur on-sea, is about 15 kms away and Andhra border is only 20 kms away from the city.



(i) Chilika

The first vision centre was dedicated to the community on 04 Sep 16, in a rented accommodation of Gurudwara Singh Sabha, in front of INS Navy Chilika. Monday, Wednesday and Saturday from 09:00 am to 12:00pm are OPD days. Patients identified for surgical intervention are brought to base hospital. The Centre is creating awareness, eye camps, referral services and sensitization programmes to Panchayat Raj Institute members, ASHA & Anganwadi members and etc., on disability inclusive eye health within a radius of 40 kms in the districts of Puri, Khurdha, Nayagarh.

(li) Jatani

Jatani Vision Centre started from 1st January 2021.







Satellite Centre

- 1. On every first day of Odia calendar month (sankranti) a fixed Eye Camp is held at Taratarini Temple (Purushottampur Block) in co-ordination with Tara Tarini Development Trust, for the poor people. People gather here to visit this famous temple and we take this opportunity to propagate eye health care message. This has been a successful program since 2006.
- 2. Since January 2012 a fixed Eye OPD is being held in Balipadara (Ganjam, Odisha) on every Friday with the support of a veteran social worker in his house. This place is well connected to nearby villages and comes under Buguda block.
- 3. A satellite centre in Daringbadi, District-Kandhamal (140 Kms one way), Odisha started functioning on 10th of every month from Apr 2015 in collaboration with an NGO "Jagruti" of Daringbadi. The response is good and in coming days we expect more patient flow from this centre.
- 4. Every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday every week Eye OPD is being held at VISION CENTRE at Chilika, Balugaon, near Naval Centre.
- 5. A Satellite Centre at Jatni Khordha District opened from 1st January 2021 catering a population of 7 lakhs. Every Sunday our team with Ophthalmologist go there and do OPD and bring Surgery Patients to be have surgery at base hospital. Every first Sunday of the month is given free consultation is given to poor patients.
- 6. This year World Glaucoma Week was celebrated there with awareness Rally in collaboration with Jatani Rotary Club.

 - : Awareness created in districts of Ganjam, Kandhamal, Gajapati, Rayagada, Koraput and Khordha using all available means.

- 2017 : First "Vision Centre" of ECOS Eye Hospital started in Chilika on 04 Sep 2016 -, Dist-Khurda, Odisha.

- 2018 : Dr. Mihir Kumar Bal, for his life long untiring community eye health activities in Odisha awarded "ACOIN Award 2017" on 09 Sep 2017 at ACOIN Goa 2017.

- 2020 : Glaucoma Week Celebration on 8th to 14th March, 2020 at Brahmapur Khallikote Stadium with live telecast in local language
 - : From 11th March 2020 Corona Pandemic declared by World Health Organisation, but lock down started from 24th March 2020 onwards which made the hospital activities stand still. The lock down lifted by September 2020. Again Corona Pandemic 2nd wave started from 25/12/20.
 - : RAAVI study in February 2021 from 8th to 25th by AIIMS, New Delhi in collaboration with ECOS in Ganjam and Khurdha District.









Overview of Statistics

Outreach activity programme continued to be the core activity, like previous years. Below Poverty Line (BPL) families remained our target group and priority patients. Rashtriya Swasthya BimaYojana (RSBY), a Central Government Health Insurance Scheme to the BPL families, finally came to an end in Feb 2019. Replacing RSBY a new Health Insurance Scheme for BPL families launched by Central Government called 'Ayushman Bharat' was not implemented by Odisha State Government. Instead, a Health Insurance Scheme with added benefits and wider beneficiary was implemented known as 'Biju Swasthya KalyanYojana' (BSKY) by Odisha State Government.

From 1st March 2020 Corona pandemic started and spread quickly, and Lock down was imposed by Govt. This curtailed our all activities after that. But with difficultly we continued to work in between. From September 2020 to March 2021 we are able to work for the people as usual.

Activities in Current Year (2020-2021)

Besides our routine activities of Base Hospital and Community Outreach through Eye Camps following activities were conducted.

- 1. 2nd BMZ Project: 1st BMZ Project of ECOS Eye Hospital was between 2013 to 2016 to enhance capacity of ECOS Eye Hospital & SCD, Titlagarh. After the success of that, 2nd BMZ Project was launched from May 2019. ECOS like previous project has been the lead partner to strengthen Eye Care Service in 10 Districts of Odisha. In this following activities were conducted:
 - 1. Improved access to inclusive Ophthalmic Service
 - 2. Improved infrastructure for service care delivery
 - 3. Improvement of technical skill of staffs
 - 4. Procurement of Sight Restoring Eye Equipments.

In this ECOS has received OCT, HFA, IOL Master 700, Green Laser from BMZ. In purchase of IOL Master 700, ECOS has also contributed besides grant from BMZ.

- 2. RAAVI (Rapid Assessment of Avoidable Visual Impairment) Study: To know the ground situation of Avoidable visual impairment in target area in Odisha. This study is undertaken by us, with technical assistance from AIIMS, New Delhi. Though it was planned to be done in February/March 2020. Due to Corona Pandemic it was conducted in February 2021 in Ganjam & Khordha District.
- 3. <u>Eye service for Prisoners</u>: Eye care was given to 40 inmates in Chatarpur Jail and spectacles were provided free of cost.
- 4. Meeting on Child Safe Guarding & Disability Awareness at ECOS : This programme was conducted in ECOS Conference Hall on 22nd and 23rdFebreuary 2020 in presence of 105 participants from different NGOs of Odisha.
- <u>5</u>. <u>School Survey activities</u>: This service was done in different schools of Chikiti, Patrapur and Gopalpur. 200 Students were provided free Spectacles by ECOS.
- 6. Glaucoma Awareness Program was done in World Glaucoma Week from 8_to 14 March 2021. Awareness for prevention & early detection of Glaucoma was done through different activities, Glaucoma related topic radio talks_& Videos were shown. Awareness rally was conducted in











Jatani, Khordha district at our Vision Centre with a Glaucoma screening camp for senior citizens was done which was well appreciated by new channels. A rally was conducted at Jatni, for Glaucoma awareness. This was done in collaboration with Rotary Club of Jatani.

- 8. <u>Training Programme for NGOs and lead openion leaders</u> in community regarding Inclusive Eye Health at our Vision Centre, Chilika on 13th January 2020.
- 9. On 11th March 2020, Covid-19 Pandemic was declared in India with strict imposition of Lock Down from 22nd March 2020. So our regular community eye health activities were jeopardized. However, following strict COVID protocols and awareness activities were done for COVID to Staffs, Patients. A triage area was created to screen patients for COVID.
- 10. Second COVID wave started around December 2020 and strict lookdown and shutdown was imposed again
