Vision

To develop and provide eye care facilities in Ganjam and neighboring districts of Orissa and Andhra Pradesh. To reduce the prevalence of preventable blindness through appropriate measures. To develop human resource for providing eye care service. To provide General Health Care Services with an emphasis on women & children to improve their quality of life by reducing un-necessary disease burden and intervention in preventive, curative and rehabilitative aspect.

Mission

To serve the people of southern part as well as whole of Orissa and adjacent states regardless of caste, creed or religion with a particular focus on the poor and marginalized in society, through the provision of quality care consisting of essential eye services, community eye health, general health, development and spiritual ministry in the name and spirit of the Lord Jesus Christ, so as to make Him known in word and deed.

History

1991

ECOS was born out of a vision of Dr. Mihir Kumar Bal when God saved his life from a near fatal road accident in 1984, while returning from an eye camp. He could see the purpose of God for which his life was saved. He considers life after that accident as a gift from God to serve Blind people. Taking a step in faith, he resigned from Government job and with the support of friends in Emmanuel Hospital Association(EHA) New Delhi, & EHA European Fellowship ECOS Ministry took shape in 1st May 1991 and was registered as a charitable society in 1992. Contribution and encouragement of EHA in the formative years of ECOS has remained as an unforgettable memory in the life of ECOS.



ECOS started a base eye hospital "ECOS Eye Hospital" in a rental building at Giri Road, Brahmapur, Odisha. It is the first eye hospital in Southern Orissa. It works in the love and spirit of Jesus Christ irrespective of Caste,

Creed or Religion. It has done pioneering works in the field of Community Ophthalmology in Southern part of Orissa and neighbouring district of Andhra Pradesh.

Christoffel Blinden Mission (CBM) International works in partnership with ECOS from 1992.CBM and World Bank Assistance Programme through Government of India (NPCB) has helped ECOS to have permanent infrastructure at 3rd Tota Street.

2012

Federal Ministry for Economic Co-operation and Development Germany (BMZ), CBM Germany and CBM SARO Bangalore helped us to have a permanent structure (Annex building) of four floors at 3rd Tota Street, Bijipur, Brahmapur(In front of present hospital). The foundation stone was laid on 01 May 2013 and we shifted to this new building on 23 Mar 16. It was officially inaugurated on 14 Apr 2016, along with "Silver Jubilee" function.

GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATION

Ganjam district, the largest and thickly populated district of Odisha is in the Southern Part of the State with population of more than 36 Lakhs. Brahmapur is the main town which is very near to the official District Headquarter Chatrapur. It has a population of about six lakhs. The famous beach, Gopalpur on-sea, is about 15 kms away and Andhra border is only 20 kms away from the city.





Outreach activity programme continued to be the core activity, like previous years. Below Poverty Line (BPL) families remained our target group and priority patients. Rashtriya Swasthya BimaYojana (RSBY), a Central Government Health Insurance Scheme to the BPL families, finally came to an end in Feb 2019. Replacing RSBY a new Health Insurance Scheme for BPL families launched by Central Government called 'Ayushman Bharat' was not implemented by Odisha State Government. Instead, a Health Insurance Scheme with added benefits and wider beneficiary was implemented known as 'Biju Swasthya KalyanYojana' (BSKY) by Odisha State Government.

In Mar 2019, General and State Elections were held and 'Code of Conduct' came into force in Feb 19, which slowed down our outreach patient's turnouts. The State Government launched "KALIA" (Krushak Assistance for Livelihood and Income Augmentation) project in Jan 19. This compelled the farmers who comes under BPL category to stay at home to receive the financial assistance. The month Jan to Mar have always been our peak harvesting period for high turn out of OPD, IP and outreach patients. Inspite, of the above hurdles we could achieved our planned target and reached to all levels of the society.

The joint project of ECOS at Bhubaneswar with Rotary Club of Bhubaneswar Royal and RC Singapore was closed on 31 Dec 18 due to operational difficulties. Responding to Emergency during super cyclone 'FANI', we participated by rendering General Health, Eye Health and relief work in Puri district with support of CBM.

COMMUNITY & HEALTH STATUS

The people here predominantly speak Odia and Telugu. The tribal population of Ganjam who mostly live in the hilly areas of Ganjam district. Brahmapur is very near to Andhra-Odisha border and around 30% of them speak and understand Telugu. Ganjam district and its neighbouring districts, specially Kandhamal, Rayagada, Gajapati and Koraput are poor and backward districts of Odisha. People are very ignorant about Eye Health Care. Cataract in old age and Vitamin-A deficiency is prevalent in large numbers. Poverty and ignorance are the main cause of poor health status in this area beside lack of medical services. Eye care is also available in the Medical College of Brahmapur City, District Headquarters Hospital, other private hospitals and practitioners.





VISION CENTRE

The first vision centre was dedicated to the community on 04 Sep 16, in a rented accommodation of Gurudwara Singh Sabha, in front of INS Navy Chilika. Monday, Wednesday and Saturday from 09:00 am to 12:00pm are OPD days. Patients identified for surgical intervention are brought to base hospital. The Centre is creating awareness, eye camps, referral services and sensitization programmes to Panchayat Raj Institute members, ASHA & Anganwadi members and etc., on disability inclusive eye health within a radius of 40 kms in the districts of Puri, Khurdha, Nayagarh.



SATELLITE CENTRE

 A Satellite centre in Aska (Ganjam, Orissa) is functioning since 26 Mar, 1999 on every Friday at Anatha Arnadana Kendra, Aska. This centre is in collaboration with Krushna Chandra Memorial Trust. On every 1st & 3rd Friday OPD is conducted and on 2nd & 4th Friday, cataract surgery is done forpatient respectively.



- 2. On every first day of Odia calendar month (sankranti) a fixed Eye Camp is held at Taratarini Temple (Purushottampur Block) in co-ordination with Tara Tarini Development Trust, for the poor people. People gather here to visit this famous temple and we take this opportunity to propagate eye health care message. This has been a successful program since 2006.
- Since January 2012 a fixed Eye OPD is being held in Balipadara (Ganjam, Odisha) on every Friday with the support of a veteran social worker in his house. This place is well connected to nearby villages and comes under Buguda block.
- 4. A satellite centre in Daringbadi, District-Kandhamal (140 Kms one way), Odisha started functioning on 10th of every month from Apr 2015 in collaboration with an NGO "Jagruti" of Daringbadi. The response is good and in coming days we expect more patient flow from this centre.

SUSTAINABILITY

To provide high quality services at highly subsidized price to all segments of the societies with surgical and diagnostic equipment's of International reputation for accuracy and better surgical outcome, like Zeiss(Germany), Alcon (USA), Topcon(Japan) and etc., we still need support of INGOs. Simultaneously to keep-up with the latest and advanced technique equipment's the need of replacing old equipment's are always a process and these involves huge amounts. However, ECOS have been progressing every year to achieve sustainability.

HURDLES

- 1. Manpower Need

- 3. Materials. Replacement of old diagnostic sight saving equipments and staff quarters.

TRAINING PROGRAMME

To meet the shortfall of trained Para Medical Ophthalmic Assistants (PMOA), ECOS started School of Optometry with affiliation to CMAI on 01 Aug 2011. So far the School had trained 12 Students in diploma course and 08 students in certificate course. PMOA from our centre are doing excellent works in different part of the State.

EYE DONATION CENTRE

Like previous years this year also it created awareness at all levels. A radio talk was also held during eye donation fortnight.









